11. Program Performance:

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funds will be utilized to expand access to career pathways in four specific areas identified by our community and economic development as high need. The project is intended to support the establishment or expansion of industry grade learning spaces, certification options, highly trained and qualified instructors, and start up operational costs. The identified programs consist of Heavy Equipment Operators to be offered as dual enrollment through Flagler Technical Institute, Medical Flagship, High Technology, and Law and Justice Flagship

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Requests are categorized as follows: Heavy Equipment-\$300,000 to support equipment rental, training simulators, technology needs for instruction, fuel costs, industry qualified instructor support, curriculum and travel costs for job shadowing, recruitment costs, tuition support. Medical Flagship-\$297,000-to support industry standard equipment such as autoclave machine, hemoglobin machine etc., licensing costs for curriculum, industry grade active learning space. High Technology-\$116,000-to support industry grade robotics and computer simulation equipment for Power and Energy and IT Development, training costs, and certification administration costs. Law and Justice-\$115,000-to support industry grade forensic and telecommunication equipment, training costs, and certificate administration costs. Career Portal Software purchase or

development-\$110,000-to track students graduating from Flagship and/or Career and Technical Courses for seven years post graduation

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Programs identified through this project for support are directly related to needs identified by Economic Development and industry leaders in our region and community. Individuals will have access to acquiring certifications and/or dual enrollment related to these high demand areas for employers. Heavy Equipment Operator courses are through Flagler Technical Institute and available to adults as well through dual enrollment for students.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Training and certification pathways will be available to students in grades 9-12 for all programs listed. Training and certification for Heavy Equipment will be available through dual enrollment for high school students, and for post-secondary students through Flagler Technical Institute. Potential impact for 2019-20 would be approximately 350-450 students for this one year period. With long term impact being multiplied by this number on an annual basis.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Outcomes include increased access and certifications in areas identified as high demand by local and regional economic development and industry leaders, increasing the employment opportunities for individuals, while reducing post-secondary debt occurred to achieve industry training and certification. Additionally, students engaged in choice programs of high relevance and rigor such as the four identified in this proposal achieve higher high school graduation rates. Individuals enrolled in the programs will be tracked post-graduation via the development or purchase of software designed to gather metrics on those who continue their education in the career pathways they participated in during their K-20 experience, and/or those who attain employument in these areas.
