Funds requested are for a shovel ready project in the City of Miami. Specifically NW 14th Avenue from NW 21st Street to 28th Street, NE 71st Street from NE 4th Court to Biscayne Boulevard, and SW 35th Avenue. The projects consist of new paving, grading, and drainage systems. Utility coordination and potential upgrades are also available for the project along the NE 71st Street and NE 5th Avenue corridor. Replacement of damaged sidewalks, updating so they are ADA ramp compliant.
