- a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?
 - LiFT will purchase a lot or current building in Pinellas County to serve the needs to students with neurodiversities, (autism and learning disabilities). The school currently serves approximately 150 students.
- b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?
 - A full educational program expanding Lift's current programs, which is presently serving approximately 150 students, will be the result of a campus expansion. LiFT University has forged partnerships with various local businesses in the community. Several of these businesses work in conjunction with the school to offer many of the students internship opportunities. These opportunities help students make decisions on what careers and jobs they wish to pursue and give them real on-the-job skills and training. One measure of the creation of immediate job opportunities would be the number and type of jobs obtained by LiFT University students. Our LiFT University students (18-23) work toward successful independence through integrated academics, social skills development and life skills training and career readiness through community internships. One measure of the enhancement of specific individual's economic self sufficiency is the number of jobs LiFT University students obtain

 Students and families with neurodiversities, autism and learning disabilities, will be served.

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Students and families with neurodiversities, autism and learning disabilities, will be served. The addition of a new campus will increase the ability to serve more students in the Pinellas County area.

The outcome of improved quality of education where the measure is higher standardized test scores can be measured by comparing the test scores of LiFT Academy students to test scores of students with disabilities in public schools. The outcome of creation of immediate job opportunities where the measure is the number of jobs obtained by LiFT University students can be measured by comparing the number of jobs obtained by LiFT University students to students with disabilities in similar settings.
