11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds requested will help build a facility that will incorporate recommendations by the University of Miami Cancer Research for the prevention of cancer in the fire fighting profession. The facility will also be category 5 rated construction that is so critical for the provision of services on our large island community. The building will also be elevated above the FEMA flood level for the prevention of water intrusion and a safe working environment for employees helping reduce PTSD especially during major weather events. The building will also serve as a regional response coordinator for maritime events and training for multi-agency response personnel, businesses, and citizens in various subjects associated with fire, ems and law enforcement services.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The City of Marco Island is the largest of the Ten Thousand Islands. There are over 100 miles of canals and the Gulf of Mexico. As a major tourist and boating destination, the city serves as the regional response coordinator for all maritime emergencies in southern Collier, the Ten Thousand Islands, and the Everglades. Additionally, over one million visitors annually to Marco including many dignitaries and major corporations the city must constantly be planning for with our corporate partners such as the JW Marriott for these events. The addition of a regional operations center and training classroom will then facilitate all of the activities associated and needed.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The primary day-to-day functions will encompass the emergency response for all fire and EMS calls. Additionally the facility will provide the coordination of multiple agencies responding to emergencies that occur within the Gulf of Mexico or the Ten Thousand Islands. These areas include Rookery Bay and portions of Everglades National Park. The facility will also serve for the planning, monitoring, and overseeing the numerous special events that occur on Marco Island for our residents and one million annual visitors. The center and training room will be utilized year round by citizens, corporations and agencies for training and response to potential active shooter, dignitary protection, and major corporate events. The JW Marriot on Marco Island has the largest amount of meeting space in Collier County and books major corporations and dignitaries.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population are the citizens of Marco Island and the thousands of boaters and people who utilize the Ten Thousand Island water areas along with the Gulf of Mexico. The second population served by this project are the one million visitors, dignitaries and corporations utilizing our major hotel resorts along the Gulf of Mexico.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Respond to Emergency Medical calls for service including the Gulf of Mexico and the Ten Thousand Islands inclusive of Everglades National Park. The design of the building will incorporate specific elements to reduce cancer exposure and stress to firefighters.
