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11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds will assist in retrofitting a building currently being used by worldwide researchers to study the ecologically, geologically significant features (including archeological and historical discoveries) of the Deering Estate property, a 445-acre state-owned property in South Dade County. When completed, the building will have expanded use, including a base of operations for up to 20 researchers at one time (conducting ecological, archaeological and geological studies) and additional educational program capacity. The facility will primarily be used to house researchers while they conduct important ecological, geological, archaeological and historical research of worldwide significance. The research conducted at the building can significantly enhance ongoing Everglades protection activities. Further, the upgraded building can also expand the programs hosted to educate the community and policymakers about the significant role the environment of the Deering property plays in the

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Deering Estate is a unique area to study the economic interaction between the Everglades restoration and key Florida industries of Fishing, Agriculture and Eco-tourism. Studies will include: Miami Rock Ridge (part of the property) forms a barrier between Biscayne Bay and the interior of the southern Florida peninsula. It establishes a geological basin that benefits the Everglades by retaining water and directing its flow from Lake Okeechobee. It contains one of the largest blocks of globally endangered pine rockland habitat in the United States. Paleo-era "Hunting Grounds," which is an original freshwater site, where the Everglades drain to Biscayne Way. Eight natural habitats, home to approximately 800 species on the Florida Natural Areas Inventory, 89 of which are threatened, endangered or commercially exploited. The 26 known archeological sites including Cutler Burial Mound, Cutler Fossil and Deering Estate, Fossilized remains from nearly 10.000 years are

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

There will be educational opportunities for the public for the public to learn the highlights of the work that the researchers conduct through public events, published research papers, and events.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is varied. Academicians and researchers that are currently drawn to this property where significant discoveries have been made will increase. Further, persons visiting the property and attending educational programs (i.e. K-12 students and others) will have greater access to this area and the programs provided on the property. The Deering Estate research station provides an invaluable service to local communities and the country by providing unbiased scientific information and facilities to help governmental and other stakeholders tackle critical environmental issues. The Estate is the only portion of the Everglades Restoration Project (ERP) located in an urban setting which is easily accessed by the public. Field station staff and researchers often play a critical role in ensuring that environmental considerations are factored into local and regional planning and development decisions.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

As research continues on the discoveries already made at the property, the awareness of this 445-acre state-owned heritage site will grow worldwide through research-related publications. Additionally, educators, K-12 students and the general public will learn about the unique environmental significance of this property. Outcomes will be measured by the increase body of research conducted which can benefit the property, the Everglades and the state as a whole.
