4. **Project/Program Description**

Project LIFT of Marion, Citrus & Levy Counties is dedicated to improving the lives of at-risk 14-19 year old teens and their families through substance abuse (opioid) treatment, mental health counseling, mentoring, education, and cognitive/behavioral replacement therapy through vocational skills training. The program offers hope to young people impacted by the "social determinants of health" -- teens struggling with addictions, lack of familial support, and academic failures. Licensed therapists and skilled mentors help them replace negative behaviors with self-esteem, skills development, and positive goals for the future. This is accomplished through mental health care with LMHCs, accredited online individualized education, vocational training, life skills mentoring, and community service. Employing unique strategies in counseling, education and mentoring, Project LIFT assists vulnerable teens in the shift from self-destructive behaviors to habits that will lead to success in life.

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11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

At risk teen males (14-19 yrs old) will receive mental health care and substance abuse (opioid) therapy through licensed mental health counselors (LHMC) to improve their mental health and help them become drug and alcohol free upon program graduation. Referrals from the criminal justice system will not reoffend. High school dropouts will improve literacy, math skills and/or graduate with an accredited diploma. All program graduates will move towards employment, enlistment or enrollment in post-secondary education. Improved economic self sufficiency. Reduced use of Medicaid and other government subsidized social service programs.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Vocational rehabilitation training. Substance abuse (opioid) therapy, education and workshops. Life skills workshops--conflict resolution, anger management, communication skills, decision making, etc. Case management. Online education through the Edmentum high school platform, an approved provider by the Florida Department of Education and the Marion County School district.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Travel accommodations through gas cards or pickup/dropoff services. Access to LMHC, Case Management, ARNP for psychiatric medication prescriptions. Vocational job training. One-on-one tutoring while pursuing a high school diploma. Mentoring in life skills. Wrap around services.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

At risk 14-19 year old males. 60 individuals are expected to be served, including 20 full-time, drop out students and 40 after school students.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Job Readiness, Workforce Development, Employment, Enlistment, Enrollment, Increased literacy and math skills, High School Graduation; Children's Functional Assessment Rating Scales (CFARS)--Industry standard of care in Mental Health Substance Abuse Inventory; Adverse Childhood Experience (ACE) Questionnaire; Pre- and Post- program surveys on job readiness. Client Long-term Success Survey--5 year tracking of graduates to assess substance abuse relapse, recidivism, employment, enrollment, and enlistment. Edmentum online High School Assessment tools to track literacy and math progress. Successful completion and graduation from high school.
