The City of Parkland is seeking funds to retrofit a drainage canal in the north eastern portion of the City. The canal serves as a collector for drainage from a number of communities eventually draining into the Hillsboro Canal. The drainage canal is in poor condition and currently has no water quality value. The proposed project would reshape and armor the canal banks as well as providing water quality improvements to the stormwater runoff.

- a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The requested funding will improve stormwater runoff from this collection canal outfalling in to the Hillsboro Canal (G-08).

- b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funding will provide for excavation and re-establishment of proper grade/invert of the canal, stabilization of the canal bank, construction of a new head wall and related water quality improvements.

- c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Funds will be used for construction and restoration costs of project.

- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

There are approximately seventy property owners immediately adjacent to the canal. Another 200 or so properties runoff into this canal. Water quality improvement would benefit residents far beyond those serviced by the canal.

- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Expected benefits of the project are twofold. First, improved stormwater runoff. Second, an improvement in stormwater runoff quality. Runoff will contain far less sediment and fewer contaminants.

No additional penalties are contemplated at this time.
