4. **Project/Program Description**

To provide for sanitary sewer service to eighty six (86) properties in the City's Original Section along Swain Boulevard from Lake Worth Road northwards to approximately 300 feet south of 10th Avenue North which would positively impact the values of the properties in the area due to enhanced quality of life. A study prepared in FY2016 recommended the construction of a vacuum sewer system which the Palm Beach County Water Utility District recommended and is willing to maintain and can be expanded to serve the remainder of the neighborhood in the future.

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11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

With the funds requested the City will be able to engage a construction engineer to develop plans for the construction of a sewer system to reduce the amount of pollutants discharged into the groundwater system through collection of all wastewater through the sewer system. Additionally, wastewater will be managed by a Public Utility instead of discharged into drain fields on small lots within a densely populated area and a reduction of pollution into groundwater by a sewer system collection of wastewater instead of septic systems, which the City has no control over maintenance, will be achieved. Reduction of pollutants leading into the LWDD Canal E-3, LWDD Canal L-11 and LWDD Canal L-10.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The service that will be completed with the requested funds is the completion of construction drawing for the permitting and construction of first phase of the sewer project that will be designed specifically to accommodate future expansion of the project in phases to ultimately provide sewer for a large area with existing substandard service through individual septic systems.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Through the development of construction plans for a sanitary sewer system in the Original Section the City will be able to provide a sanitary sewer system to the residents of the City.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Target population are residents occupying eighty six (86) properties along Swain Boulevard in the Original Section of the City.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The City will have plans in place to move forward with the construction of a sanitary sewer system which will increase property values in this area of the City, promote development and redevelopment of existing properties and improve the quality of life for the property owners along Swain Boulevard.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Should the City not complete this project as requested or meet set deliverables, the City should be required to reimburse the contracting agency for all funds provided to the City.
