The mobile center will provide programs and services for people living with or affected by HIV, youth, and youth at-risk of/experiencing homelessness in a generally unaffirming areas to improve quality of life through access to community, support, and care.

b.	What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?
	INTERSECTIONS will provide access to peer-led support groups, recovery groups, wrap around services for homeless youth, cyber center, access to housing, resources and referrals to competent providers. Social activities will promote the development of community and safety within neighborhoods.
c.	What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?
	Pridelines will provide HIV/STI testing. Case management, job readiness support, access to holistic therapies, linkage to housing,

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Elderly persons, persons with poor mental health, persons with poor physical health, jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, homeless, drug users (in health services), high-school students, university/college students, currently or formally incarcerated persons, victims of crime, LGBTQ youth and their straight allies. Serves 200-400 persons.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improve physical health by connecting clients to medical providers by having a number of clients connected to Federally Qualified Health Centers within 24 to 48 hours. Improve mental health by increasing self-esteem by administering the Rosenberg-Self-Esteem Assessment; a 10 item scale that measures global self-worth by measuring the both positive and negative feelings about the self. Protect the general public from harm by increasing participation from community based organizations and businesses in the neighborhoods frequented by INTERSECTION. Reduce substance abuse by increasing participation in recovery groups. HIV testing, awareness and outreach by increasing access to HIV testing and provide tests and treatment within 48 hours.
