- a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

All funding received will be used to remove, renovate, and enhance improvements to homes that have hazardous health-related issues and/or other code violations. The presence of hazards in homes such as lead-based paint, mold, and pests threaten the health and safety of individuals living in these homes.

- b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The City of South Bay plans to address the substandard housing in its community by renovating and enhancing homes that have experience serious health-related and/or building code violations. This program will help improve citizens' quality of life, beautify the community, inspire other citizens to maintain their homes, and provide jobs to the area.

- c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Home owners in desperate need of quality repairs will receive improvements that will provide them with better, safer housing that will increase property values. Home improvement contractors and their employees will benefit from the job opportunities created by the program.

- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All qualified home owners must be city residents and reside full-time in the home. Currently the city has 23 seniors signed up on a housing rehabilitation waiting list.

- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Addressing the health, safety and social-emotional problems associated with substandard housing can provide children and adults with a stronger foundation to succeed in school, their employment, and ultimately lead to more fulfilling lives. The methodology and performance data will be tracked and documented including number of individuals served, number of homes improved, services provided, code violations eliminated, and the number of contractors hired.
