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11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Facilities will be more secure with professional security guards in place and through the use of fencing, CCTV systems and upgrades, bulletproof glass, screening systems, etc.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Schools will employ contracted security guards, licensed by the state and insured, to provide detection, prevention and other security services. Schools also will install security hardening systems and upgrades, as indicated to be necessary by security audits by local, state and national law enforcment.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Security guards implementing improved security procedures, while preventing, detecting and managing security problems; and
 Facility target hardening systems and upgrades to make schools more secure

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is students, staff, parents and community members. With more than 13,000 preK - 12 graders in Jewish schools, approximately 24,000 staff and parents will be protected on a regular basis plus thousands of community members frequenting school and community events.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

More secure facilities where students, staff, parents and community members can learn, meet and participate in school and community events. There are several measurements including the absence of any major security events, the reported prevention of major security events and reports from schools on the security improvements on their campuses.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Jewish schools and pre-schools that provide inaccurate counts of their pre-school and full time K-12 students will be ineligible to apply for the security grant for three years.
