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1.	Program Performance
a.	What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?
	Extending taxiway "E" and building a new ramp are required to develop new GA facilities and prepare shovel-ready space for new aerospace and aviation-related schools and businesses. Relocation of GA operations to the north end of the airport is also necessary for commercial airline facilities to expand the current footprint.
b.	What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?
	Initial design engineering has been completed. Funds will be used for final plans and construction services to build the proposed taxiway and GA ramp
C.	What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?
	This appropriation is a necessary step in creating a hub for GA activity that will be accessible to the citizens of Charlotte County and surrounding counties. Through the new general aviation center and adjacent aviation development, citizens will be exposed to more training and career opportunities in these targeted fields. Citizens will also be better served by the delineation of GA from commercial airline facilities, as it will improve the ease of use, roadway connections, and parking amenities for citizens. In 2018, Allegiant's passenger count at PGD reached 1,577,164, a number which is projected to continue increasing steadily.
d.	Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?
	PGD is home to 400 based aircraft utilized by a variety of stakeholders, including private citizens, the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office, Civil Air Patrol, non-profits, corporate charters, and air carriers. These aircraft serve the business, training, and personal use needs of pilots in Charlotte County and surrounding communities. Of PGD's 84,113 operations in 2018, 85% were general aviation takeoffs and landings. In 2018, the authority leased 21 sites to non-aviation tenants, 40 sites to aviation-related tenants, and 230 T-hangars. While current tenants may be the first to use the extended taxiway and GA ramp once completed, the project is setting the stage for dozens more tenants and hundreds of new jobs in flight instruction, avionics, aviation, and aerospace.
e.	What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
	Staff will oversee and inspect the vendor's construction of the taxiway extension and ramp, ensuring it's completed on time and within the budget. Since this is an infrastructure project, new permanent jobs will not be realized until the completion of the general aviation center and hangar facilities. Staff will benchmark the number of tenants and jobs at the completion of the project to compare with resulting economic activities and successful business recruitment.
f.	What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?
	Holding 10% retainage from each of the contractor's monthly pay applications (invoices) and exercising liquidated damages.
