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11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Teacher recruitment and retention for agriculture education will be enhanced by updating curricula and land labs, which will lead to stronger agricultural education programs for students. As a result, students will be drawn to register for agricultural education classes and participate in intra-curricular activities offered through these programs. The more students are exposed to and participate in related activities, the more they will be drawn to be a part of the agriculture industry as adults.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Activities and services will be determined by the local FFA chapters at each participating school. Examples could range from purchase of upgraded materials and equipment to support the students and teachers as they work on their specific Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) projects to creating curriculum and professional development.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The direct services the citizens will receive will be an enhanced program of agriculture education. This enhanced program will include the use of updated equipment, technology, and curriculum. The service will also increase a greater opportunity for students to grow in their individual educational experiences (SAE) and leadership opportunities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is middle and high school students. The project is expected to serve 20,000 individuals.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Benefit: Enhanced equipment and supplies, labs, along with more qualified and financial compensation to agriculture teachers for duties over the standard work day, reducing vacancies for agriculture teachers. Methodology for measurement of Improvement: Quality standard program monitoring system; increased number of agriculture education programs and student enrollment; increased student knowledge gained through new curriculum; Increased teacher knowledge gained through professional development; number of students earning industry certification/participating in other standardized tests;

teacher participation in professional development; and DOE records of agriculture education programs in the state.

All funds would be used in accordance with agreed upon contracts. Failure to do so would result in forfeiture of future funding.
