The DeFuniak Springs Coy Burgess Loop Watermain upgrade project would provide water infrastructure to serve properties adjacent to the US-331 Corridor south of I-10 that currently do not have service. The project would encourage economic development within the City of DeFuniak Springs by providing capacity that is not available in the existing system. Additional capacity allows for new development and industrialization to occur. The expansion would also provide fire protection.

- a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Upgrades to the Coy Burgess Loop Watermain would provide a main water transmission line from the well located on Coy Burgess Loop to US-331. This line would support growth in this area and provide for capacity for future development in this area.

- b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

New commercial and residential developments and new mixed use developments can be created due to providing the needed water main connection.

- c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The construction project would provide immediate job opportunities for the entire area as it would require utility crews and landscape and irrigation workers to complete the project.

- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Many individuals who live and visit the region would benefit from this project. Some that would be immediately impacted are those individuals who are unemployed or economically disadvantaged by the economic impact resulting in new jobs in the food, lodging and retail industries.

The economic impact would benefit the entire region as success can be measured by population growth, increased property value (tax revenue) and the creation of additional jobs in the area.

The City will award the contract through a bid process. The bid documents will spell out liquidated damage costs for project overruns. The bid documents will also require the selected contractor to provide performance and payment metrics to the city.
