This project includes milling, resurfacing, and widening to accommodate curb, gutter, and drainage improvements as well as reconstruction of NW 99th Terrace to provide two 11-foot-wide shared use lanes for automobiles and bicycles and one 12-foot-wide double left turn lane. Ancillary improvements in this project include drainage improvements as well as signing and pavement markings, landscape areas on the north side of the road, and a 6-foot-wide sidewalk on the south side of the road. Additional improvements that are part of this project include signing, pavement marking, and minor drainage improvements.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The main purpose of this project is to retrofit existing infrastructure to improve transportation and mobility. Additionally, drainage improvements will alleviate ponding through the corridor that impacts local businesses as this is an industrial area. Landscaping enhances beautification features of the corridor for local residents.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The activities and services will include milling, resurfacing, and widening to accommodate curb, gutter, and drainage improvements and reconstruction of the road to provide two 11-foot-wide shared use lanes and one 12-foot-wide double left turn lane. Ancillary improvements include drainage improvements, signing and pavement markings, landscaping on the road's north side, and a 6-foot-wide sidewalk on the road's south side. Additional improvements include signing, pavement marking, and minor drainage improvements.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This project will benefit local residents and other users of the area by improving the roadway and the storm-water management facility, providing bicycle continuity, providing pedestrian facilities, and installing landscaping for beautification. In addition, the expected benefits of this project are to alleviate transportation/storm-water issues, improve safety, and provide mobility continuity to this area in the Town of Medley.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



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The general public and businesses will be served by this project. The town anticipates more than 800 individuals to be served by this project.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The benefits of this project will be measured by improving the socio-economic impact to local residents and commercial/industrial activity by assessing time savings in traveling and the impact of the roadway improvements to the public based on the number of users, the traffic volume and density as well as the redirection of traffic from other roads. Increased level of service for automobiles. Reduction of automobile related accidents due to enhanced safety features.

The contract will have standard language that will include liquidated damage or debarment.
