The Town received \$500,000 in legislative appropriation in FY2018-19 to assist in funding the Royal Oaks Drainage Improvements Project. The Project included the construction of the drainage system in two (2) areas: Area 1: NW 164th Street to NW 165th Terrace, from NW 87th Avenue to NW 84th Court and Area 2: NW 167th Terrace to NW 169th Terrace, from NW 81st Avenue to NW 79th Avenue. This Project is now complete.

This project includes the design, permitting, and construction of the drainage system comprised of drainage pipes, exfiltration trenches (French drains), and asphalt restoration between NW 166th Terrace to NW 168th Street, from NW 83rd Place to NW 82nd Avenue.

Flood mitigation activities, including the design, permitting, and construction of the drainage system comprised of drainage pipes, exfiltration trenches (French drains), and asphalt restoration between NW 166th Terrace to NW 168th Street, from NW 83rd Place to NW 82nd Avenue.

##### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Flood mitigation activities to further reduce or eliminate the risk of repetitive flood damage in the Royal Oaks community.

##### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Target population served by this project is the Royal Oaks residential community in Miami Lakes. The project will directly impact approximately 60 homes.

##### e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?



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Expected benefits include improved drainage, reduced localized flooding, increased drainage capacity, improved stormwater management, eliminated standing rainwater, reduced probability of mosquito-transmitted diseases to the public, and reduced impact to property and life. Outcome will be measured by field inspection and documentation of rainfall events.
