We received \$263,000 in PPP funds used for Payroll support. We were closed for 2.5 months to the public and for school field trips, and we are still seeing a low return of visitor and student groups which is a major portion of our revenue.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The goal of the initiative is to continue to integrate The Bishop's Mosaic Backyard Universe, into the county's network of early learning resources, enhancing the School District's efforts to coordinate and deliver an integrated continuum of educational programs for the county's underserved PreK-Grade 2 students and their families. The Bishop has 15 Title 1 schools within a 6-mile radius of the Museum. We will also provide STEM education to as many Title 1 school classes in PreK- Grade 2 with free transportation and admission fees to the Museum, outreach into classrooms and VPK providers and virtual field trips as requested.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The School District and The Bishop will collaborate on the delivery of SOAR in 4 family programming for all Title 1 families in Manatee County with regular programs offered throughout the school year coupled with professional and parental development opportunities. The Bishop will provide outreach to VPK providers, virtual classes and no cost inperson field trips, including transportation in the two county area. The grant will continue to support professional staff for program development, implementation, school group and outreach scheduling and oversight.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?



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Title 1 students and teachers, their families and VPK providers will have free access to early learning resources at The Bishop for school field trips and for coordinated programming by the School District and partner agencies serving this audience such as with SOAR in 4. Outreach programming for VPK providers will be coordinated with partner agencies modeling parent/child engagement practices in science education. Both teachers and parents will be offered professional as well as parent development learning opportunities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Underserved and Title 1 PK-2nd grade students, their families and their educators. We expect to serve more than 5-8,000 low income children and families in this second year of service, navigating any post-COVID restrictions. More served if schools and providers are operating in a more normal situation.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

We expect to see the percentage of underserved/Title 1 students performing at grade level by grade 3 increase annually. It will take three more years to see the results of the program and measure overall effectiveness. The School District's "Universal Identifier" for each child in the County will enable us to evaluate the number of programs each child participates in, as well as their academic achievement.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Grant funds from the 2019-2020 year allocated to the LEARN Grant were reimbursed to The Bishop only after a review and approval by the Department of Education's Office of Early Learning so there are no funds disbursed prior to a review and approval to ensure The Bishop meets the deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract.
