12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Simply put, too many young children with autism (ASD) are waiting for services. Given ASD prevalence (1 in 54 children), it is critical for children to be diagnosed as early as possible so that effective, evidence-based interventions can be prescribed at an early age. Easterseals proposes to identify and serve up to 214 in the Northeast Central Florida region for early diagnosis, Comprehensive Diagnostic Evaluations (CDE) and intervention treatment for children with ASD. We've partnered with state-wide Easterseals affiliates to treat up to 40 children as an expanded pilot of the PLAY Project. PLAY is a parent implemented, intensive early intervention program for young children with autism that is evidence-based and can be provided at 1/10 the cost of therapist delivered services. It is cost effective, easily implemented, and can serve large numbers of families efficiently. We anticipate our outcomes will support a case for public policy changes in service delivery options.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Easterseals receives physician referrals, locally and regionally, for Autism Diagnosis and Functional Assessment on a regular basis and potential clients for diagnostic services are channeled through a bi-weekly clinic to receive therapy (occupational, physical and speech/language) and audiology evaluations, parent interviews, case management and administration of the Autism Diagnostic and Observation Schedule (ADOS) 2, with a follow-up meeting for differential diagnosis and treatment plan with a clinical psychologist or psychiatrist.

Additionally, up to twenty clients will be identified to receive intensive, evidence-based interventions – Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) or PLAY (Play and Language for Autistic Youngsters) Project, both of which demonstrate great success for children with ASD to make significant gains in Functional Development Levels.



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c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Service tasks, tracked by individual client and reported monthly, would include the following:

a) Functional assessment (initial evaluations and functional skill assessment through OT, PT, ST, audiology test and ADOS-2); b) Clinic coordination and case management; c) Final psychological assessment and diagnosis by a team psychologist or psychiatrist; d) Post-diagnosis treatment and action plan—education and support for families to obtain and engage in services; and e) Treatment—provide recommended therapies/interventions and family education.

Interventions include: Occupational, Physical and Speech Therapy, and evidence based interventions, including P.L.A.Y. Project (Play and Language for Autistic Youngsters), Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) and Social Skills group training.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Our target population is up to 150 children 18 months to 18 years who have been referred by their physician for autism assessment and diagnostic services. Further, we propose to extend our pilot of the PLAY Project (Play and Language for Autistic Youngsters) up to 20 children with our partner Easterseals affiliates across the Central Florida region. Specifically, the PLAY Project targets young children (ages 2-6) as an evidence-based alternative to traditional services which have long waiting lists. The PLAY Project is devoted to helping parents develop a better connection with their child through play, and helping the child improve their language, development, behavior, and social skills.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Performance Measures that will be tracked for a proposed 150 NEW clients include:

- a) 75% of the children referred by their Physicians for diagnostic and functional assessment shall complete the process within the funded year
- b) 80% of client parents/guardians will receive a detailed plan of care at the time of diagnosis that addresses behavior concerns and prescribed therapy interventions
- c) 85% of the parents, guardians or legal representatives receiving a thirty (30) day post-diagnosis check-in call shall have completed the initial steps to access all recommended resources and interventions following a family support call d) 85% of the children enrolled in evidence-based interventions (ABA/Social Skills and PLAY Project) will demonstrate monthly gains in one or more Functional Development Levels
- f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Since we are proposing a direct services contract, we would expect not to be paid until the monthly reporting of performance levels met the contract expectation.
