### 12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The primary goals of this project are to improve safety for all road users, reduce pedestrian/bicyclist conflicts, provide accessible and comfortable roadways, and improve the quality of life.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Proposed activities will include: removal/replacement of deficient sidewalks and ADA ramps, installation of truncated domes and hand rails on ramps, construction of curbs and retention wall, excavation, asphalt work, cleaning, grubbing, and sodding.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The proposed roadway improvements provide safety measures that are considered to be a service to the targeted population and all road users.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The general population of the targeted area is more than 2,000 with 900 households and approximately 1,250 school age (K-12) children who are within walking distance of three Pinellas County schools: Pinellas Park Elementary, Skyview Elementary, and Richard L. Sanders Exceptional Education Center, for students with learning exceptions. Businesses make up a large portion of the eastern boundary for this project.

The targeted population benefits from public services - library and city hall are within walking distance.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?



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The expected benefits of the Pinellas Park Community Safety & Mobility Project are improved road conditions for all users, equitable accessibility, and improved quality of life.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Agencies that contract with the City of Pinellas Park are required to purchase surety bonds at 100% of project cost. Payments may be held pending completion of performance measures and deliverables being met.

The roadways included in this project are city-owned and the City of Pinellas Park is the only entity receiving capital outlay funding.
