This area currently does not have sidewalks or curbing and the roadway pavement is deteriorated. The proposed improvements will improve safety and ADA accessibility, as well as improve drainage. The project proposes to construct sidewalks, ADA ramps, curbs and gutters, and repave the roadway.

The city received \$500,000 for a business assistance program and \$336,000 for a residential assistance program. In addition, the city received \$195,687.23 in reimbursements for expenditures for PPE, supplies, testing, sanitizing (\$64,599.77), public information costs (\$3,826.82), telework expenses (\$96,883.73), tech items (\$1,739.32), and permanent structural changes (\$28,637.59).

The funds would be used to reconstruct NE 153 St., thereby providing increased accessibility for users. Construction work will include improved drainage (by constructing curbs and gutters) and also a better driving surface by re-paving of the roadway.

This project will be for the construction of new curbing, and drainage, and pavement improvements.

Traffic management, roadway safety, and storm drainage management.
