12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The inclusion of a fixed LPR system at areas of ingress/egress to the city allow for real-time alerting of known wanted vehicles.

This includes stolen vehicles, vehicle involved in felonies, vehicles thought to be carrying missing persons such as those with Alzheimer's or dementia, etc.

The return benefits on the use of this technology has already proven to be very high in terms of recovering property, safely locating endangered people, and reducing/solving crimes.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The installation of fixed License Plate Reader cameras to the major ingresses and egresses of the City of Pembroke Pines.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The enhancement of the LPR program will assist victims of crime within the City of Pembroke Pines. Expanded use of LPR technology will increase arrests and assist in terms of recovering property, safely locating endangered people, and reduce/ solve crimes.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Residents, visitors and victims of crime. At least 800 or more individuals or more are expected to be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will



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be measured?

Funding for this technology pays proven dividends in real time alerting of missing persons, abductions, and major felony suspect identification/location. The reduction in crime increases the overall quality of life for the residents and visitors of the city. Statistical analysis and thorough review of incidents reported and cleared by arrest will be conducted.
