12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Ongoing educational programs and tours for K-12 students, especially JROTC cadets, 5,000 Role Models, and other great Florida youth groups such as Sea Cadets. The museum will maintain a robust liaison with FIU, MDCC, UM, and Florida Memorial University (an HBCU). A regular agenda of patriotic Days of Remembrance and Days of Observance (MLK Day, Memorial Day, Pearl Harbor Day, Veterans Day) will be open to all. The museum will host meetings for civic groups such as the Daughters of the American Revolution, Society of Military Engineers, and Gold Star Families of America.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Tour groups of grade school students and field-trips by 27 local high school JROTC cadet units. Spelling bees and essay contests. Respect and civic understanding will be fostered for the American system of government and for the uniform, by young and old alike. Equally, regard for law enforcement, fire fighters, first responders, VA, and other health professionals. The museum has a memorandum of understanding with the VA that once the pandemic is past the museum will host trained clinicians of the Vets Center providing counseling to veterans regarding substance abuse, marital and financial issues, and suicide prevention.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The proposed Public Affairs Officer is a retired K-12 teacher and an Army Reserve Major (Ret): Mr. Floyd was the 5,000 Role Models Program manager for local high schools, building social inclusion and integration. The proposed Educational Specialist is a retired K-12 teacher and Lt. Col. in the USARF (Ret). Mr. Gammon is very qualified to lead school-group tours, JROTC field trips, the history bee, and essay competitions and academics. The proposed Superintendent of the historic building is a retired GC and an Army veteran. The proposed Executive Director is an FIU history professor and a retired Naval Officer.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Veterans of all branches of the service, active duty members, reserve members, their families, and groups such as the VFW and the American Legion. Tour groups of grade school students. Field-trips by 27 local high school JROTC cadet units. The museum will foster respect and civic understanding for the American system of government and the uniform, including law enforcement, fire fighters, first responders, VA, and other health professionals. The museum expects to serve over 50,000 visitors at least. That is a conservative estimate, since every year over one million people visit Zoo Miami next door. Presenting our shared American heritage is the cornerstone of the museum.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

US Southern Command, Central Command, Special Operations Command; Eglin, McDill, Patrick, and Homestead Air Force bases; US 4th FLEET; USCG 7th District; NG Camp Blanding; NAS JAX; Pensacola; and Key West are integral to the safe economic well-being of Florida, as are its 1.5 million veterans. \$21 billion in veteran-related federal money flows into Florida each year. The museum will devote an entire museum gallery to Florida's military community and assist these units in every way possible to get their stories to the public, while hosting military ceremonies, weddings, reunions, and conferences.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Failure to meet the deliverables or performance measures which the agency will provided in its contract for administering the funding will result in the funding being withheld.

Miami-Dade County Parks and Recreation owns the property/cantonment that is the museum location. The museum is a nonprofit with a 50-year lease of one dollar annually for the property.
