This project is intended to extend a reclaimed water line along Riverside Drive. The extension will allow those residents to connect to reclaimed water for irrigation purposes. Well water in this area is of poor quality and there have been numerous requests for reclaimed water. This project will help to reduce/eliminate the amount of effluent from the wastewater treatment plant that is discharged into the Indian River Lagoon.

#### 12. Program Performance

#### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The extension of a reclaimed water distribution line to existing residents will afford the City a reduction/elimination of treated wastewater effluent discharge to the Indian River Lagoon. The Indian River Lagoon has been designated by the state as a nationally renowned aquatic ecosystem that supports tremendous biodiversity and is part of the National Estuary Program. The City of Edgewater partnered with the Cities of New Smyrna Beach and Oak Hill as well as Volusia County to develop a Reasonable Assurance Plan and extension of reclaimed water lines is one of the projects contained in the Plan.

#### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Construction of the reclaimed water will allow those existing residents to connect to the reclaimed water distribution system and use the reclaimed water for a beneficial purpose, rather than direct discharge of the treated effluent to the Indian River Lagoon.

#### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Numerous residents have requested the extension of the reclaimed water system along this area so they can use the water for irrigation purposes. Well water in this area is of poor quality for irrigation and the only other alternative is using potable water. This is not the best use of potable water in a state where water is an area of concern with the future projected growth of population and the limited resources the state of Florida has for potable water.

#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population directly served by this project is estimated to be 600. However, essentially all residents of the City of Edgewater and anyone else who recreates on the water will be served by this project as the reduction of reclaimed water will benefit the Indian River Lagoon, which is a significant recreational waterway for the residents.

### e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will



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The expected benefit of the project will be a reduction of reclaimed water that would otherwise need to be discharged to the Indian River Lagoon. This will reduce the amount of Total Phosphorus, Total Nitrogen and Total Suspended Solids entering the Indian River Lagoon.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

If the City fails to meet the deliverables of the contract, the City will reimburse the State for the funding.
