12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Anti-Semitic acts of violence are more prevalent today than ever. The October Homeland Security Threats Report indicated that white supremist were the number one threat to the US. Locally, our Sarasota/Manatee community has been victim to an increasing number of anti-Semitic acts of violence in the last few months Protect citizens who visit the campus for: holocaust education, performing and visual arts programs, summer camps, swimming, soccer and other sports, training and community outreach programs, to name a few.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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See attachments which outline the entire campus. The Federation and its security leadership work closely with law enforcement, FBI, SWAT and other first responders to keep the community safe. It has become evident that a Training Center is needed to educate and engage front line workers from teachers to law enforcement to parents and beyond. The Center will be a community asset to teach curriculum on social threats, First Aid/CPR, security breaches and others that will keep the region safer.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Training as described above.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Thousands of people of all ages and walks of life from across the region, Florida and nationally may visit campus for holocaust education, for camps, for performing and visual arts, education, recreation and social interaction.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

- i. Improve physical health
- 1. We expect to build a 25-meter swimming pool with an aquatics center; 4 tennis courts; pickle ball courts; and running and walking tracks.
- ii. Improve mental health
- 1. We expect to have numerous meeting rooms and classrooms for seniors, teens, families and others.
- In addition, there will be a plethora of arts and cultural opportunities provided to a diverse audience
- iii. Enrich cultural experience
- 1. We will be able to host events/activities from 20 1,000 individuals in auditorium style and 500 in rounds, with an inhouse caterer and 400+ parking spots.
- Activities include film festivals, book festivals, speakers, plays, musicals and more.
- iv. Improve quality of education
- 1. Data has proven that Holocaust education and security measures may prevent anti-Semitic and racist acts.

The Federation Campus will host scores of teachers from Sarasota County, Manatee County and Dioceses Schools. In addition, we will be able to host thousands of students,
