12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The purpose of this request is to address the College's capacity to provide workforce training and access to technology in the federally designated Opportunity Zone of Midtown St. Petersburg. These efforts will impact all generations by reducing K-12 education gaps, preparing young people for higher education, and offering short-term workforce training to prepare community members for current in-demand, high-wage jobs.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

These funds will provide students additional opportunities to access technology and workforce training within Pinellas County, with a focus on an impoverished community. Funds will ensure that community members have access to the technology and educational opportunities necessary to obtain in-demand mid-high wage jobs.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Addressing the needs of the industry, the program will provide short-term workforce training that provides skills needed for the workforce, including continuing education, certificates, licensures and career pathways. Having dedicated space for these technology driven programs will enhance current workforce training programs and industry partnerships.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



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Elderly persons, at risk youth, high school students, college students, any member of the community.

Increase exposure to and participation in cultural activities for residents in a low-income community. Increase access to technology and technology-driven workforce training programs.
