There is a significant amount of inflow and infiltration experienced in the vacuum sewer valve pit at the County courthouse and in other downtown areas. During heavy rain events, large public events at the nearby park, and high water table conditions, the valve struggles to discharge the flows into the vacuum system. When that valve is struggling other valves downstream begin to struggle to overcome the additional heads. This scenario results in backup into businesses. The source of inflow and infiltration needs to be determined and the appropriate corrective actions taken, This would include evaluating all downstream services on this zone for similar conditions.
