12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The first goal is for low-income veterans in the Second Judicial Circuit impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic to have their civil legal needs addressed, increasing stability, security and economic prosperity for local area veterans. The second goal is for

service providers across the state of Florida to receive training on legal issues and advocacy, thereby enhancing advocacy for veterans across the state.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Individual case representation and community legal education for veterans affected by the COVID-19 pandemic in the areas of housing, consumer, public benefits and family law.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

We expect to serve 120 low-income veterans per year through individual case representation. We expect to serve 200 veterans, service providers and pro bono attorneys per year through statewide legal education trainings (total = 320 served per year).

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is low-income veterans residing in the Second Judicial Circuit who are affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, as well as service providers and pro bono attorneys serving veterans across the state of Florida.

We expect to serve 120 low-income veterans per year through individual case representation. We expect to serve 200 veterans, service providers and pro bono attorneys per year through statewide legal education trainings (total = 320 served per year).
