#### 4. Project/Program Description

Mental Health Services at the Steven A. Cohen Military Family Clinics at Aspire Health Partners and Centerstone will provide critical expansion of behavioral health services for National Guard, veterans and their families regardless of discharge status. Too often, National Guard, veterans and military family members live life coping with trauma and mental health issues related to their military service. Aspire and Centerstone will provide evidenced based, culturally appropriate, person centered therapy for mental health issues including depression, anxiety, post-traumatic stress, adjustment issues, anger, grief and loss, family issues, transition challenges, relationship problems, and children's behavioral problems. Services will include assessment, case management, outpatient psychiatric, and telehealth treatment. Aspire and Centerstone will target National Guard, post 9/11 veterans, and their families.

#### 12. Program Performance

#### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Aspire Health Partners and Centerstone will provide behavioral health services for National Guard and post 9/11 veterans and families regardless of discharge status; to include outreach, assessment, case management, outpatient and telehealth treatment to promote recovery, reduce relapse and increase functionality. Veterans, including those from the National Guard, Reserves and their families will be served. Services are designed to help individuals and families address mental health issues including depression, anxiety, post-traumatic stress, adjustment issues, anger, grief and loss, family issues, transition challenges, relationship problems, and children's behavioral problems. The goal is to support veterans and their families as they begin their next mission: healthy and happy lives and Getting Back To Better.

#### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Aspire Health Partners and Centerstone will provide assessment, case management, outpatient, and telehealth treatment services as described in Ch. 65D-30 and in accordance with the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitative Facilities (CARF) accrediting standards.

#### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?



Aspire Health Partners and Centerstone will provide behavioral health services, including assessment, case mgt, outpatient, and telehealth treatment, for post 911 veterans and their families. They will use best practices including the following Evidence-Based Practices: Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT), Cognitive Behavioral Therapy for Insomnia (CBT-I), Prolonged Exposure Therapy (PE), and Cognitive Processing Therapy (CPT). Services will be provided in individual and group settings and telehealth.

#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Aspire Health Partners and Centerstone will serve National Guard and post 9/11 veterans, families and active duty persons coping with mental health issues including depression, anxiety, post- traumatic stress, adjustment issues, anger, grief and loss, family issues, transition challenges, relationship problems and children's behavioral problems. They will serve all targeted veterans including those from the National Guard, Reserves, and their families, regardless of discharge status. They will target post 9/11 veterans and their families. Services will be provided to veterans and their families statewide.

# e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Measurement based outcome assessments collected by the clinics per the Cohen Veterans Network.
