Construction of a new 725-foot elevated boardwalk connecting a new public access pier to the zoo's existing main path. The ADA accessible bridging, 6 feet wide and featuring top and bottom rails and mesh in between, will safely accommodate thousands of visitors accessing the zoo by watercraft.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Construction of a hassle-free 725-foot elevated boardwalk, in compliance with ADA Standards for Accessible Design, will provide easy public access for all guests arriving via watercraft, including people with mobility restrictions.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

By constructing the bridging, the Zoo, in partnership with the City of Jacksonville's Parks, Recreation, and Community Services and the Jacksonville St. Johns River Taxi service, will once again allow public access to all guests that arrive via water. This funding would cover the cost of the boardwalk. The pier, which will connect to the boardwalk will cost \$1.1 million and be funded by the Zoo and the City of Jacksonville.

The original pier, damaged during Hurricane Irma and unable to repair, was a popular attraction for boaters of all types from across the region.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

During the construction phase, jobs will be provided. Once the elevated boardwalk is completed, additional jobs will be provided to manage the space.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Populations to be served by this project will include: all residents living along the Trout and St. Johns rivers; Jacksonville water taxi service riders; Visit Jacksonville; and downtown dwellers, including hotel guests, tenants and transient boaters (anywhere from hundreds to more than a thousand annually).

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Benefits of the project include: improved zoo public access, community resources and development, as well as increased economic activity measured by a rise in attendance and zoo income.



f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The Zoo operates through a public/private partnership with the City of Jacksonville. All property, including animals, equipment, and improvements, belongs to the City of Jacksonville, which in turn contributes an annual subsidy to offset some of the Zoo's operating expenses. The City provides less than 9% of the Zoo's annual budget through this partnership, whereas the average contribution for city-owned zoos in the United States is between 40-50% of the budget. All other Zoo expenses are paid.
