### 12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

As one of the fastest growing metro areas in the state and the nation, Lee County is always in need of project funding to construct the road network. Lee County has \$166 million worth of projects underway to expand the road network and assist with congestion. Funding for Ortiz Avenue will assist Lee County with keeping the project on track.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funds will be used to pay the contractor responsible for constructing the roadway. With assistance from the state, Lee County will be able to keep the project on track. Due to a decline in local option gas tax collection this project has a potential to not be funded in FY 2021/22 without the state assistance.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This segment of Ortiz Avenue is part of a much larger regional transportation corridor that connects from Palm Beach Boulevard (SR 80) to Summerlin Road near Sanibel, through the direct linkages of Ortiz Avenue to Six Mile Cypress Parkway, then to Gladiolus Drive, and finally to part of McGregor Boulevard. It also serves as a parallel reliever to I-75, helping to take local traffic off the interstate.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Ortiz Avenue has an average annual daily traffic count of 15,400 vehicles.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Lee County DOT measures the level of congestion on major arterials county-wide. The widening of Ortiz Avenue will help to relieve congestion on I-75. Average traffic data can be collected and reviewed after the widening is complete.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties
