The goal of upgrading city hall begins with a new roof, which would eliminate continued interior damage to the building. The purpose would extend the life span of the building and promote a positive work place for employees.

In addition, the city, which serves a predominantly poor and rural area of the state, will not have to face the financial burden of making payments in the future to continue to repair a failing roof.

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Provided that the city receives the funding, an adequate roof will be installed to eliminate continued damage to the interior of the building. The roof would be automatically placed under warranty for a time certain, as well as the upgrades in city hall. These items are measurable and will also be warranted for a time certain. The agency receiving the bid for the upgrade will be held accountable for work results that may end in a fine or a reimbursement for warranty violations.
