In addition, the city, which serves a predominantly poor and rural area of the state, will not have to face the financial burden of making payments in the future to continue to repair a failing roof.

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Provided that the city receives the funding, an adequate roof will be installed to eliminate continued damage to the interior of the building. The agency receiving the bid for the upgrade will be held accountable for work results that may end in a fine or a reimbursement for warranty violations.
