4. Project/Program Description

Florida ranks among the top three states affected by human trafficking. Central Florida is the third most prevalent area within the State for crimes of human trafficking. The Lifeboat Project is working hard to end this harrowing injustice. Every day, the Lifeboat Project is doing more than raising awareness for labor and sex trafficking; we help victims become survivors. The Compass Program is a structured three phase program known as "Safe, Heal, Grow". The Compass Program addresses the potential hazards and challenges faced by its clients and their lifestyles. Individualized Survivor Plan's and phase work are client-centered, developed to help the client overcome their traumatic experiences in a safe environment, with a strong emphasis on building life skills that support independence and self-sufficiency.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The goal of the Lifeboat Project is to continue to provide unique life-long trauma informed services for the current clients we serve within our safe-house, transitional homes, and within the community. We also have a goal of expanding our services to more victims as they self-identify or are referred to our agency. We provide lifelong trauma-informed services, equipping survivors with the supportive tools necessary to establish sustained freedom, self-sufficiency, and independence.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Case management that is trauma-informed and client-centered, including counseling with a LMHC, housing, medical referrals, transportation, educational support, and employment resources for victims/survivors of human trafficking.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Wraparound services which includes medical referrals, mental health services, therapy, housing, transportation, educational support, and other resources as needed for victims/survivors of human trafficking.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



The Lifeboat Project provides comprehensive services in a structured environment 7 days a week, 24 hours a day to adult victims/survivors of human trafficking, regardless of gender, faith denomination, racial-ethnic background, sexual orientation or socioeconomic status. Participants may self-refer or be referred by other community agencies, including, but not limited to, law enforcement officials, corrections officers, and courts. We can serve up to 20 adults in-house and in the community.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

Survivors' success are measured through their length of stay and progress in the Compass Program. This is defined by the completion of the Individualized Survivor Plan. The Compass Program has three core phases known as "Safe, Heal, & Grow" for survivors to navigate through. The end goal is for survivors of human trafficking to become self-sufficient and independent.

This is a client-centered, trauma-informed continuum of care which includes a minimum of one-year in length of stay at the facility. Upon admission to the program, each individual meets with the Treatment Team consisting of multidisciplinary staff, external service providers (medical, dental, counseling and psychiatric, legal, probational, educational, vocational and life-skills training) and family members, where possible, to assist with information surrounding the individual's life vision. With these components, holistic, individualized service plans are successfully facilitated.
