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 Increase or improve economic activity: Increased retail and business establishments in downtown Miami. Methodology: Measured by Miami Downtown Development Authority via existing and new businesses on and near Flagler Street.
Increase tourism: Increase in tourist footprint to historic locations throughout Flagler Street and surrounding areas. Methodology: Tourist development taxes. Reports by Miami Downtown Development Authority.

- Improve transportation conditions: Enhanced intersections, wider sidewalks, landscape and irrigation upgrades, on street valet parking. Methodology: Counts on public transit usage in correlation with festivals and events in downtown Miami.

- Create specific immediate job opportunities: Create additional 2,600 jobs. Methodology: The Miami Downtown Development Authority forecasts 2,600 additional jobs from 2020-2025 in the sectors employing labor in downtown Miami, on and surrounding Flagler Street.
