The purpose of this project is to provide water and sewer utility infrastructure improvements to meet the current needs of the existing customer base and to accommodate future demands for this rapidly expanding City.

Design and construction of water and sewer mains and appurtenances.

Improved water pressure and availability as well as sewer capacity for existing development and property owners looking to develop.

All citizens in the City of Freeport as well as visitors; greater than 5,000 people.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Increased and improved economic activity would be measured by new commercial and residential development, new mixed use developments and new industry being created due to additional capacity being provided and the ability for the City of expand its services beyond what is existing. The success of economic activity would be measured by population, commercial and industrial growth, as well as increased revenue for the City. Increased tourism would be measured by the City being an end destination for travelers. This success would be measured by an increase in services, such as food, lodging and retail facilities, as well as recreational businesses. After design and permitting activities are completed, immediate job creation would be provided by the construction of this project. The construction project would provide immediate job opportunities for the entire area due to the project requiring utility crews, and various types of construction crews to complete the project.
