a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Fully fund 20 congressional internships for low income and diverse Florida students. These internships will help them launch their careers in public service.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

C2C provides flights, housing, meals, a professional wardrobe, and assists with other costs associated with interning in DC.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

College to Congress provides comprehensive training, mentorship, and assistance with securing an congressional internship.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

20 low income, diverse students attending Florida colleges and universities.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Our goal is to secure congressional internships for low income and diverse college students. Students who intern are 68% more likely to receive a paid full-time job. 90% of our alumni are currently working in public service, thanks to their internship. C2C tracks the students' internships and post-internship careers, as well as their socioeconomic status.
