12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The goals are to meet the Miami-Dade Local Mitigation Strategy initiatives, mitigate flood and property losses, improve traffic safety for residents, and local services (police and fire rescue), and to keep the city from potentially losing revenues due to residents leaving the city. This is the final and essential stage of the stormwater Master Plan covering the residential area of the city.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Installation of a comprehensive stormwater drainage system and along with accompanying piping structures, catch basins, junction boxes, exfiltration trenches, and potential stormwater forcemains, positive drainage pipes, asphalt overlay, and swale restoration. The system includes catch basins installed at lowest grade elevation within the road right-of-way, and connected by a series of drainage pipes.

This system will remove stormwater from the City's roadways thereby mitigating floods and property damage and losses, and it will improve traffic safety for residents, and local services (police and fire rescue), as well as those who commute through the area on a daily basis. It will also increase vehicular and pedestrian accessibility.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Drainage, stormwater improvements, mitigation of floods and property damage and losses, improved traffic safety for residents, commuters, and local services (police and fire rescue), and increased vehicular and pedestrian accessibility.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



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The many residents (20,000 approx), property owners, and business owners of the City of Sweetwater along with FIU, Keiser, URBE and San Ignacio University students and those who frequent the City's establishments, as well as those who commute through the City on a regular basis. Millions of people transit this area every year as it is home to the Dolphin Mall, Ikea, and several other highly frequented businesses and institutions.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Mitigation of stormwater flooding and property losses, improved traffic safety for residents, and local services (police and fire rescue), increased vehicular accessibility (commercial and non-commercial) and pedestrian accessibility as well as increased commerce.

The level of flooding in the area as a result of heavy rainstorms will be measured (in inches) before and after the project. The amount of time it takes for floodwaters to recede will also be measured before and after the project.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Cancellation of contract and payment for liquidated damages. The Contractor may also be prohibited from entering into business with the City again in the future for a certain period of time.

The City of Sweetwater owns the roads in which the project will be constructed. They are City right-of-ways.
