12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Hardening of the village public safety building to maintain the facility as a reliable base of operations for first responders and support staff during a storm event. The proposed project will secure the building envelope to protect critical technology and 911 communications needed for effective police/public safety. Improvements to withstand 185 mph wind load (windows, doors, overhead bay doors, roof, and AC) together with a generator will allow for uninterrupted or delayed critical services.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The proposed hardening project includes replacement of 60 windows, 4 doors, 7 bay doors, and building roof system to withstand 185 mph winds. This effort also includes a mitigation activity to install 4 AC units for cooling the public safety servers running the emergency dispatch system and radios. Also a 350 kw generator to run the entire public safety building during power loss is included.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The proposed hardening of the village public safety building will ensure that police, fire, and emergency medical services can continue to operate without interruption from a significant weather event. The ability of personnel to stage and work out of the facility during and after a storm is crucial in protecting personal safety and property within Palm Springs.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Target population is the 25,000 residents of Palm Springs.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will



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be measured?

Secure 911 emergency communications system in a hardened structure. The ability to shelter first responders and emergency communications staff in a public safety building (currently rated for Category 2 storm) during a storm event to allow emergency response and rescue and hazard and damage assessment as soon as winds reduce to <35mph. The existing building is in the centralized in heart of the village. Damage to unhardened building could jeopardize operations of emergency communications and safety of public safety personnel assigned to "shelter at work," as well as delay emergency response and rescue/recovery operations. Alternative building(s) for public safety operations during storm events (exceeding Category 2 strength) that are centralized for village services are not present.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Withhold funding until deliverable is in acceptable form to the agency. Standard contract penalties are sufficient.
