**a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?**

The City of Miramar is proposing a storm water infrastructure improvement project within Historic Miramar to reduce flooding in the area. The project area is poorly drained, has no water quality treatment, and has experienced nuisance flooding due to inadequate storm water management facilities. The project design is complete and all environmental permits were obtained. The project is currently in construction.

**b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?**

The majority of the existing right-of-way is dependent upon percolation provided by the existing swale system for storm water management. Over time property owners have filled a majority of these swales with landscape features, reducing the percolation capacity of the swales and resulting in localized areas of flooding. In November 2017, AECOM completed a Stormwater Facilities Plan.

**c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?**

Citizens will be provided with new and significantly improved drainage systems that will mitigate ponding and localized flooding on the residential roadways within their communities.

**d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?**

Residents historic district of the City.

**e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?**

Storm water runoff will receive some treatment though the ex-filtration trenches prior to discharging to outfalls.

Liquidate the damages and start the performance bond process.
