a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Lake Nona campus has grown to serve 5,124 students annually which represents a 375% increase since its opening in 2012. In the first five years, the campus has experienced double digit growth each semester. 2019-2020 classroom utilization averaged 120% and Florida's Department of Education is projecting a Capital Outlay FTE increase of 150% over the next five years. The campus will be unable to support this continued increased demand.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

This building will support multiple advanced STEM programs providing student education and training.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The following degree and certificate programs are being considered for the Lake Nona Campus in conjunction with the addition of a second building. • A.S. in Medical Laboratory Sciences • A.S. in Medical Equipment Technology • A.S. in Human Performance/Coaching • A.S. in Nursing • Certificate in Clinical Laboratory Sciences • Certificate in Clean Room Technology

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The primary target populations of this project are: jobless, economically disadvantaged persons, high school students and university/college students. This building is planned to serve an additional 5,000 students annually.
