The project will improve the treatment processes sufficient to meet all state environmental permitting requirements and benefit the area environment by producing reuse uality effluent for irrigation purposes and redirecting waste loads from the Airglades Airport to the City's NPDES permitted igher-level wastewater treatment facility allowing for the decommissioning of the existing smaller Airglades wastewater eatment facility.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

To comprehensively modernize the existing NPDES permitted City WWTP facilities to provide for enhanced treatment processes to satisfy DEP consent order requirements; increase treatment capacity to provide for septic to sewer conversions & economic development opportunities for underdeveloped properties west of the city along the U.S. 27 highway corridor including the AIA site; allow for environmental enhancements including producing reuse quality effluent suitable for irrigation purposes which reduces groundwater demand; and, also decommissioning the existing airport wastewater treatment facility.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

For any significant economic development to occur in the Clewiston area and for environmental compliance to be achieved while meeting service demands by providing for expanded capacity, the City's Wastewater Treatment Plant must be upgraded as proposed by this project.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?



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The proposed modernization & expansion project of the existing NPDES permitted City WWTP will improve overall public health, safety and welfare of the community at large. Specifically, environmental conditions in the areas served, which are in close proximity to Lake Okeechobee, will be improved while providing the opportunity to expand public wastewater disposal services to more citizens thus accommodating reasonable growth and economic development potential to enhance the local economy and overall quality of life of the entire region. Importantly, the requested funding will provide for the much needed improvements in a manner that will allow customer rates to remain affordable in a fiscally constrained community with among the highest unemployment rates and lowest wage rates in the state.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The completion of the modernization of the existing City WWTP with the requested additional capacity will benefit the entire population of the city limits and areas served outside the City currently including the Harlem community and several mobile home park properties in close proximity to the City totaling approximately 15,000. The proposed treatment capacity expansion which will provide for economic development opportunities along the U.S. 27 highway corridor and including the AIA project site will indirectly benefit all of Hendry County's 40,000 population, as well as, portions of adjoining counties including specifically rural Glades County.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The City will satisfy DEP pending consent order requirements in total with this WWTP modernization project completed. The additional treatment capacity will allow the connection of existing failing septic systems to convert to public wastewater treatment including the undersized existing Airglades Airport package treatment plant to be decommissioned. Increased capacity will also provide for economic development of the AIA project and for the areas west of the city limits along the U.S. 27 highway corridor to include the airport. All these improvements and outcomes will add substantially to the overall quality of life, as well as, public health, safety and welfare of the entire region. As a result of this project, lower unemployment rates, higher prevailing wage rates and increased public sector revenues resulting from enhanced property values associated with new private sector investment are anticipated positive outcomes over time which can be measured.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

As these are public investments in infrastructure and provided that the City uses the funds appropriately under state agency oversight, no penalties should be incurred by the responsible local government agency.

The City of Clewiston will continue to own, operate and be responsible for ongoing operations and maintenance of the capital improvements constructed with the requested funding.
