The goal for the use of the funds being requested is to reduce stormwater flooding in the selected project area. This project, once completed, will result in the unimpeded continued use of the roadway; Reduction of stormwater flooding; reduction of the foreseeable effects such as infrastructure erosion, reduction of negative contaminants to the State's aquifers and improvement to the overall health and safety of the community and commuters.

The proposed project will yield capital infrastructure/street improvements to the proposed area which is in a designated flood zone.

Both the local community members and commuters who traverse the roadway shall enjoy the unimpeded use of the targeted roads. Community members will benefit by not being exposed to health and environmental factors that result from stormwater flooding.
