The City of Coral Springs received CARES Act funding in the amount of \$5,051,203. These funds were used for administrative expenses, COVID-19 testing and contact tracing, food distribution, housing support, improvement of telework for employees, nursing home assistance, payroll for Public Health and Safety employees, personal protective equipment public health expenses, and small business assistance. FEMA funding was received in the amount of \$275,393 for a city-run COVID-19 vaccination site.

### 12. Program Performance

### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The west side complex supports multiple city departments such as Public Safety, Public Works, and Central Stores. These departments are critical to the safety of city employees and citizens. Funds will help to harden the facility, which currently may not withstand a major storm or hurricane event. Hardening this facility protects critical equipment and allows public works employees to be safely housed in the facility to ensure immediate access following a natural disaster. This project will decrease recovery time and lessen taxpayer costs for recovery while ensuring public safety and navigable roadways for the community.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The city will undertake a major renovation of the building to ensure that equipment, citizens, and staff are safe and secure.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The citizens will benefit from the city's ability to clear roadways to provide for passage of emergency vehicles in the event of a hurricane or major storm. Safe, navigable roadways are critical to ensuring the safety of the general public after a major storm or hurricane by providing for passage of emergency vehicles and enabling the public to access needed services.

### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All 133,000 of Coral Springs residents will be served by this project.

Outcome will be measured by the taxpayer cost and duration of disaster response efforts immediately following a major storm or hurricane event (i.e. number of streets that are cleared after a hurricane or major storm event).

Failure to meet deliverables or performance measures could result in forfeiture of funds. Standard contract penalties are sufficient.
