Brevard County - Indian River Lagoon, Max Brewer Causeway Breakwater

This project, at the gateway to the Kennedy Space Center and the Merritt Island National Wildlife Refuge, will construct an offshore breakwater to protect the south side of the Max Brewer Causeway from erosion while sheltering seagrass, a major horseshoe crab spawning area, and a highly popular recreational beach on the Indian River Lagoon. This area has recently suffered erosion, bringing the shoreline 11' from the edge of pavement. The project will restore and protect resources while

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The goal of this project, located at the gateway to the Kennedy Space Center and the Merritt Island National Wildlife Refuge, is to protect the south side of the Max Brewer Causeway from erosion using a design that will also provide recreational benefits and environmental benefits, to include sheltering seagrass and the most significant horseshoe crab spawning area in Florida. This area has recently suffered erosion, moving the shoreline to only 11' from the edge of pavement. The project will restore and protect resources while making the causeway more resilient to rising seas and extreme storm events.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

An offshore breakwater will be constructed along 2600' of causeway to protect the road and provide shelter for horseshoe crab spawning activity along the causeway shoreline. In addition, more seagrass and clams will be planted in the lagoon in the lee of the breakwater to support water quality and habitat restoration in the Indian River Lagoon.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The breakwater will protect a highly popular recreational sandy beach access to the Indian River Lagoon.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Hundreds of carloads of locals and visitors use the beach weekly. A trailhead for the Coast to Coast bike trail is currently being developed on this same causeway.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit of this project is accretion of the shoreline instead of erosion, protection of the causeway, shelter for seagrass and clam habitat, and safeguard of an important horseshoe crab spawning site.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Past performance should be taken into account by bill sponsors. Brevard County continues to meet its deliverables.

The site is sovereign submerged land held in trust by the State of Florida for the public. Brevard County will contribute design documents, secured permits, and construction management.
