The work will provide for wastewater conveyance rehabilitation necessary for residents and businesses throughout Coconut Creek and Parkland and ensure environmental hazards are not created by aging wastewater infrastructure, such as negatively impacting the existing impaired water body, WBID 3270, also known as the C-14 "Cypress Creek" Canal..

Wastewater infrastructure will be inspected and relined/repared or replaced as needed.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This work will ensure continuous wastewater collection services to the residents and businesses of Coconut Creek and Parkland service areas.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The City of Coconut Creek's service area includes the majority of the City's residents and businesses as well as a large portion of residents and businesses in the City of Parkland. The City has an estimated population of 57,833 residents.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?



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Expediting inspections and repairs will mitigate exfiltration of wastewater into the groundwater due to aging infrastructure, which could negatively impact the existing impaired water body, WBID 3270, also known as the C-14 "Cypress Creek" Canal. The expected benefits of the project include continuous wastewater collection services within the area directly served and safeguarding our regional environment and natural resources for residents, tourists, and future generations. This would be measured by the number of wastewater overflows and breaks are reported annually as part of the NPDES permit.
