42% of these funds will be disbursed as emergency grants to students to provide direct assistance to address the financial impacts of COVID-19.

51% of funds are to enhance remote instruction; expand access to tech; invest in improvements to address air quality, health, & safety; address student healthcare & mental health services; and recover lost revenue.

7% for faculty & staff for their resiliency in maintaining operations.

# 12. Program Performance

### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Florida Department of Economic Opportunity's Regional Demand Occupations List data shows that by 2028, Polk County is projected to need an additional 4,788 registered nurses. These funds will allow the College to expand Health Sciences programs, like Nursing, to begin to keep pace with the demand for skilled healthcare professionals.

# b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funds will be invested in additional simulation and instructional equipment to support more students in both classroom and lab settings. Funds will also be used for renovation of existing facilities to accommodate additional students and create effective spaces for simulation laboratories.

# c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Investment in additional simulation equipment provides students with hands-on, realistic experiences that serve to supplement their clinical requirements. Additionally, in some programs, the use of simulation may alleviate some of the pressure on clinical scheduling and would facilitate students' time to completion.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



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Economically disadvantaged persons; grade school, high school, and university and college students.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Investment in the expansion of Health Sciences programs will provide the opportunity for Polk State to produce more graduates to fill current and future critical workforce needs. This provides an attractive environment for businesses seeking to expand or locate in Polk County. Additionally, individuals who graduate with degrees in the field of Health Sciences are eligible and prepared for employment in high-demand, high-wage jobs, and have the opportunity to improve the quality of life for themselves and their families. Measurements will be based on performance measures including Wages and Job Placement/Continuing Education rates, combined with feedback from industry partners.
