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The city was awarded CDBG-CV funds for \$1,012,565 for housing and utility assistance, meals to COVID-19 affected individuals, and small business grants. Approximately \$2.1 million as sub-recipient of Miami-Dade County to reimburse the city for COVID-19 related operating expenditures. \$183,000 through DOJ to cover COVID-19 related police OT. Approximately \$2.5 million in PA funding from FEMA for reimbursement of COVID-19 related exp. and 2 vaccine claims. \$19,192,087 in ARPA funds which the council is to decide funding use at a later date.
