4. Project/Program Description											
	The specific purpose of the funds is to provide transitional long-term counseling services beyond the initial trauma response assessment and clinical interventions required for 30 individuals and/or families who have been impacted by the collapse of Champlain Towers South in Surfside that occurred on June 24, 2021. Jewish Community Services (JCS) provides culturally-responsive services to individuals and families that include trauma-informed counseling with a focus of crisis response, debriefing, stabilization and grief counseling offered in English, Spanish, Yiddish, Hebrew, Russian, and French either via a HIPAA compliant tele-mental health platform or in person. We anticipate serving this population of dissurvivors as well as family members for a 12 month time frame. Clients will be served regardless of race, religion, gende ethnicity, and ability to pay for services.

### 12. Program Performance

### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The dramatic surge in need for mental health counseling and supportive services resulting in new clients seeking these services as a result of the Surfside tragedy has increased the need to build capacity to fund long-term mental health services for these populations. Many lost all of their possessions and may not be able to return to work until there is a period of stabilization and normalization in their lives. This results in the need to subsidize trauma informed care services for long-term therapy. These new individuals and families need access to services immediately and will require long-term support, anticipated between 3-5 years after a disaster. Our professional team of mental health professionals will provide culturally competent, trauma-informed care.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Licensed clinical mental health professionals will serve a total of 30 clients for a 12 month period providing one counseling session per week. The counseling session will be provided via a HIPAA compliant tele-mental health platform or in person, depending on client preference. Upon initial intake, the clinician and client identify a treatment plan with specific and individual goals. Client will be assessed at 6 months and again at the 12 month mark to identify if goals have been achieved or if goals/services provided need to be adjusted.

Trauma-informed mental health counseling services will be provided either via our HIPAA tele-mental health platform or in person. This will be dependent upon the client's request. Clients will receive mental health support for a 12 month period.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population for these funds are those individuals and families who have been severely impacted by the Surfside building collapse. Services will be provided regardless of the individual or families race, religion, ethnicity, gender, or ability to pay. We anticipate serving approximately 30 individuals and/or families.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

80% of clients will demonstrate a decrease in symptomology and report positive mental well-being. This is assessed by the Children's Functional Assessment Rating Scale (CFARS) and Functional Assessment Rating Scale (FARS) for adults at the 6 month time frame and at planned discharge. A comprehensive sliding scale model is implemented to track payment via reduced cost enabling those to receive services who may be unable to afford the true cost of services, which is \$150 per session.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

There is a severe adverse impact in denying emotional and psychological support to those who were impacted by the tragic event of Champlain Towers South collapse. Should these clients not be provided trauma-informed mental health counseling support to address immediate needs, they risk employability and ultimately self-sufficiency.
