12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Our purpose is to provide a residential drug and alcohol rehabilitation program for men and prepare them to return to their families and our community as productive citizens. The goal is also to reduce the recidivism rate for students who have been incarcerated. The property that House of Hope of Florida, Inc was leasing was sold and the program was moved to temporary housing which greatly restricts the number of students who can be served. The new facility and staffing will allow the program to return to serving up to 25 students.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

House of Hope Florida, Inc provides an intense, one year program focusing on the rehabilitation of our students and assisting with their re-entry back into the community. Instructors lead 12-step programs including narcotics, Alcoholic Anonymous and Celebrate Recovery along with other substance abuse recovery classes. Individual and group counseling as well as separate re-entry classes are provided. Each student is paired with a mentor for weekly meetings and encouraged to seek NA, CR, or AA sponsors. Students participate in volunteer activities throughout the week.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Operations Manager: overall charge of supervision. On-site Managers: 24/7 supervision. Financial Director: Handling student funds and providing financial planning and employment assistance for students in the re-entry phase. Mentors will assist with guiding the students through the recovery process and the clinical therapist and counselors provide individual and group counseling. Family members will be provided with information about Al-Anon and encouraged to speak with the counselors for their benefit and to assist in the recovery process for the student.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



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Target population: men over 18 with a desire to overcome their drug and alcohol addiction. Working with the court system and probation and parole, House of Hope of Florida, Inc also accepts students coming from correctional facilities and ensures that all guidelines and conditions of release are followed. The new facility will allow for up to 25 students.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

With the increasing cost of drug addiction for our society, both economically and socially, this program seeks to increase the success rate of our graduates and to lower the rate of recidivism among those students who have been previously incarcerated. The benefit is not solely for the student but also for his family as statistics show that drug addiction can often be generational. The confidential statistics gathered by the clinical therapist will be reviewed to increase program effectiveness and graduates will agree to be tracked for a period of 2 years after leaving House of Hope of Florida, Inc to gauge their success rate and gather any suggestions to improve the program.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Any unused portion of funds would be immediately returned to the State.

The Board of Directors for City of Hope International, dba House of Hope of Florida, Inc would oversee the project and disbursement of funds as needed throughout the project in cooperation with the Finance Director and Executive Director for the ministry as well as an outside accounting firm.
