4. Project/Program Description

The City of Belleview needs a vacuum truck to be used in cases of emergencies in our water and sewer system such as clogs, backflow issues, sewage overflows, and flooding. Currently, the City utilizes outside contractors to perform this work at a large price, especially when services are requested after hours and on the weekends. This cost is in the tens of thousands each year, but is unavoidable because the city does not have a vacuum truck. In addition to reacting to these emergencies when they occur, the City of Belleview will be able to be proactive with the purchase of the truck. Field employees will be able to complete hydro excavation, line cleaning, catch basin and storm drain cleaning, containment pit maintenance, and lift station maintenance.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The purchase of the vacuum truck will save the City of Belleview tens of thousands of dollars each year due to the need to use emergency on-call contractors after an issue has already occurred. It will also allow us to work proactively to to prevent flooding and sewage backups in homes and businesses in our service area.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The City of Belleview will purchase a Vactor Impact Hydrovac Vehicle that removes the threat of backflows, sewage overflows, and flooding because of sewage or drain clogs.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The citizens will have the highest level of service that can be provided and a reduction in the amount of issues in the system from other users.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All citizens on Belleview's water and sewer system will benefit from the purchase of this equipment. Approximately 8500 individuals and 550 businesses are served by our system.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit and outcome will be immediate drop in money spent for emergency on-call pumping by external contractors, increased lifespan of pumps and pipes, and better ability to clean and maintain lift stations and sewer lines that will result in a reduction in sewer backup issues. The city will be able to measure this by comparing budget reports and work order types.
